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





miss my loving mother.








Fancy Dress Competition

Our moppets of GIS are gaining all this knowledge by participating in the scheduled activities throughout the week.
















Good touch Bad Touch




PARENT TEACHER MEETING


Parents were assured that there are sincere efforts taken by the school and the teachers in providing quality education to the children, thereby looking forward to the betterment of the child.




BONALU CELEBRATIONS






Bonalu is a Hindu Festival where Goddess Mahakali is worshiped and celebrated in Telangana state, India. Bonalu is celebrated usually during Ashada Masam that falls in July/August. The festival is considered as a form of thanksgiving to the Goddess after the fulfillment of vows. Bonam means Meal in Telugu, which is an offering to the Mother Goddess. Womenfolk in the household prepare rice that is cooked along with Milk, Jaggery in a New Earthen or Brass Pot, which is adorned with Neem Leaves, Turmeric, and Vermilion. Women carry these pots on their heads and make an offering of Bonam, including Bangles and Saree to the Mother Goddess at Temples. Bonalu involves worship of Kali in her various forms such Mysamma, Pochamma, Yellamma, Dokkalamma, Pedamma, Poleramma, Ankalamma, Maremma, Nookalamma, etc


ACTIVITY BASED LEARNING
